(*April 20th-22nd 2007*)

This event is the first of two schemes to bring in a large chunk of money. We realised that to complete the chassis structure of 6880, the massive forgings at the front (extension frames) to hold the cylinder block would have to be made. The likely cost of these based on the experience of Didcot's Saint project is approx. £30k. Based on our current monthly income, it would be a long time before we could raise the amount.

We have approached the Board of the Llangollen Railway and gained approval to hire the railway for a Gala event. We will pay for all the costs and take all the profit. That means a lot of hard work organising and in particular marketing it.



The full details of the event will be available on a dedicated website (under construction) linked to the 6880 website. A comprehensive leaflet will be printed in November with between 10,000 and 25,000 copies. A database of all railways, railway societies, model railway clubs, model engineering societies and other transport organisations is being developed for a mailshot with the leaflet. tended, Major Galas at other railways will be attended, as will large model railway exhibitions, in the lead up to ours, in order to distribute the leaflets. Major adverts are being prepared for the railway press.

With the event currently looking to have a massive 10 engine line-up (5 home fleet and 5 guests), two autocoaches, trade stands, a five inch gauge railway and a Beer Festival. Attractions will include pay to drive, pay to ride a brake van and an intensive timetable running from 8am till 11pm on the Friday and Saturday (8-5pm Sunday), it should pull the crowds. We are hoping to match the KWVR gala which saw 4200 people over two days.

We hope you as members will do your bit to help us. This could be in advance by helping to distribute the leaflets in your area or on your travels. Alternatively you could help with marshalling at the event. Some of you may have useful contacts. Already we have some members who are obtaining sponsorship for barrels of real ale. Do you know someone who works for a local brewery that could donate a barrel in return for advertising in the beer festival program? Please get in touch if you can help!!

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
The item still requiring sponsorship is the brass cabside numberplate.

The first half of the year has seen a concentration of effort being put into work on the frames, but with some attention being paid to work on the boiler. Strip down enabled a thorough inspection and this has revealed the good news that this boiler was only 5 years old when Willington Hall was sent to Barry as scrap. We have been surprised with just how good the condition really is, prompting the comment 'almost as good as new'! There is still a lot of work to do, but we have a very good base to begin with. The frames were dispatched to Jay Engineering for precision machining, and were delivered back at the end of May with all the work completed.



Once the frames were returned to us we started the transformation from a flat-pack set of parts into the basic shape, and all without an Ikea Allen key in sight! This was mostly accomplished over a single weekend, but it was nearly a non-event due to lack of M64 treaded bar to finish off the new adjustable frame jacks which we needed to make the final adjustments to the frames. A few phone calls and a mad dash to RCF in Tipton on Friday afternoon by Will saved the day. We thought we had enough for all our stands, and those made for Hugh Shipton, but we had a last minute redes-

ign approved by Dave Owen so we went with the new design. We have ended up with 6 finished, and two still to be made, but we now own a set



a stands you could stack six Kings on. Despite several minor injuries by the end of Saturday the frames were on the stands and we had made a start on the levelling, this was finished on Sunday. We now have the frames on the stands, the stretchers attached and everything is level. Future jobs include some countersinking, replacing some of the angle irons which look a little thin after machining and more preparation for riveting everything together. The team is now in close discussion with Llangollen Engineering regarding the accurate assembly of the frames. It is likely that they will receive the job of completing the next stage.

The company is now VAT registered, and we have submitted another Gift Aid claim, both of these tax reclaims will help your donated pounds go a long way further. As always, thanks for your contribution, without you it would not be happening



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New Funding Scheme "Express".

Last year, new member Richard Cadge made a very interesting proposal. Concerned that with only a very gradual increase in members paying £10 per month, it might take several decades to complete the project, he proposed a new direction.

His idea is to find a total of 50 people (including himself) to put in £68.80 a month for 100 months, making a total of £6880 each. This would raise £344,000 which with the gift aid and our other members contributions and fundraising etc, would bring in the £500,000 required. The locomotive would be built in an 8-9 year period if take-up of the 50 places is rapid. We have decided to go ahead with this proposal and named the scheme "Express". The scheme will be promoted with a new information pack designed by Craig Tiley, containing all the required information. A limited number of these will be printed and given to members and contacts with a serious interest in the scheme. We hope to launch it very soon!!
